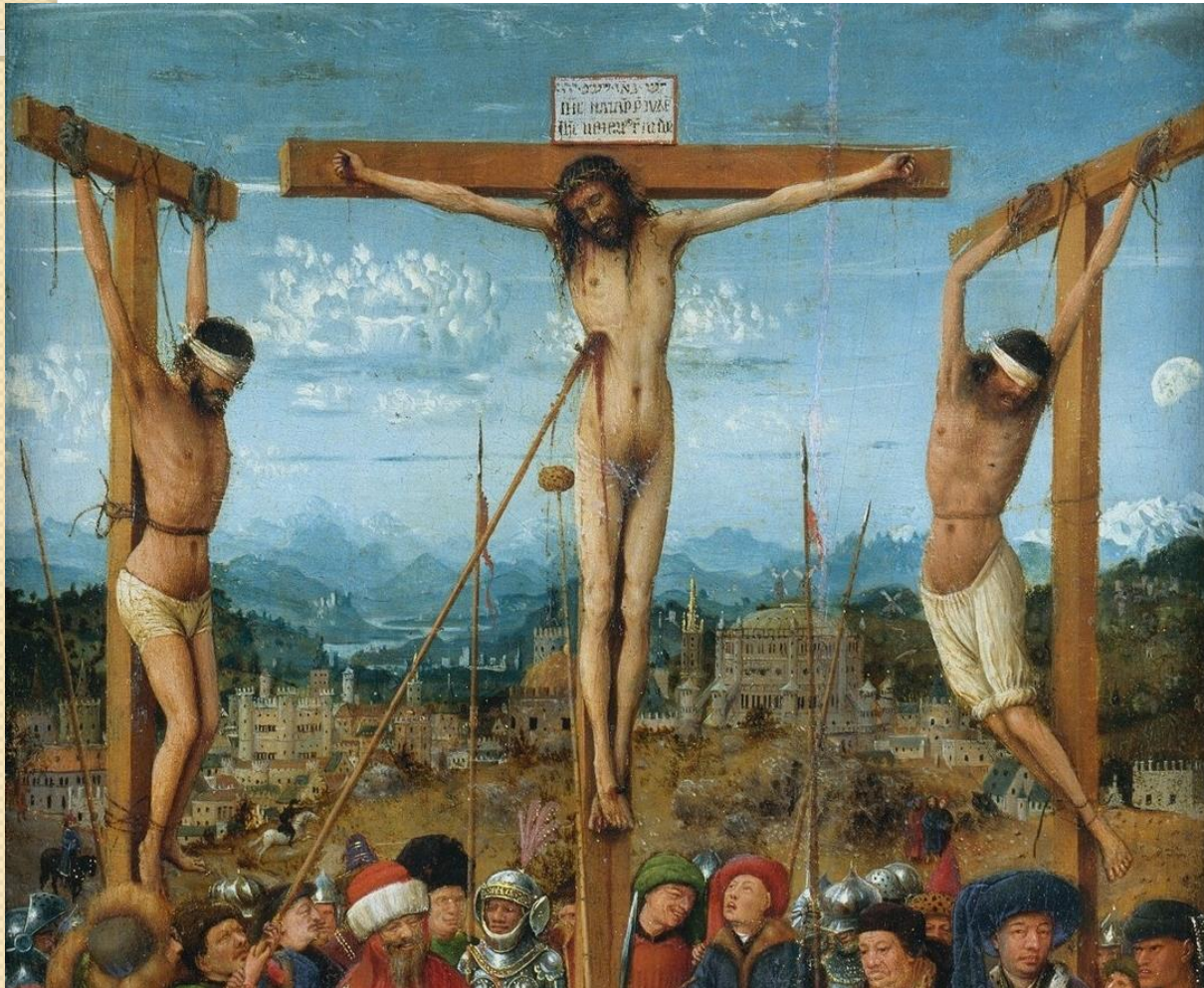

Judgment diptych, ~1420*

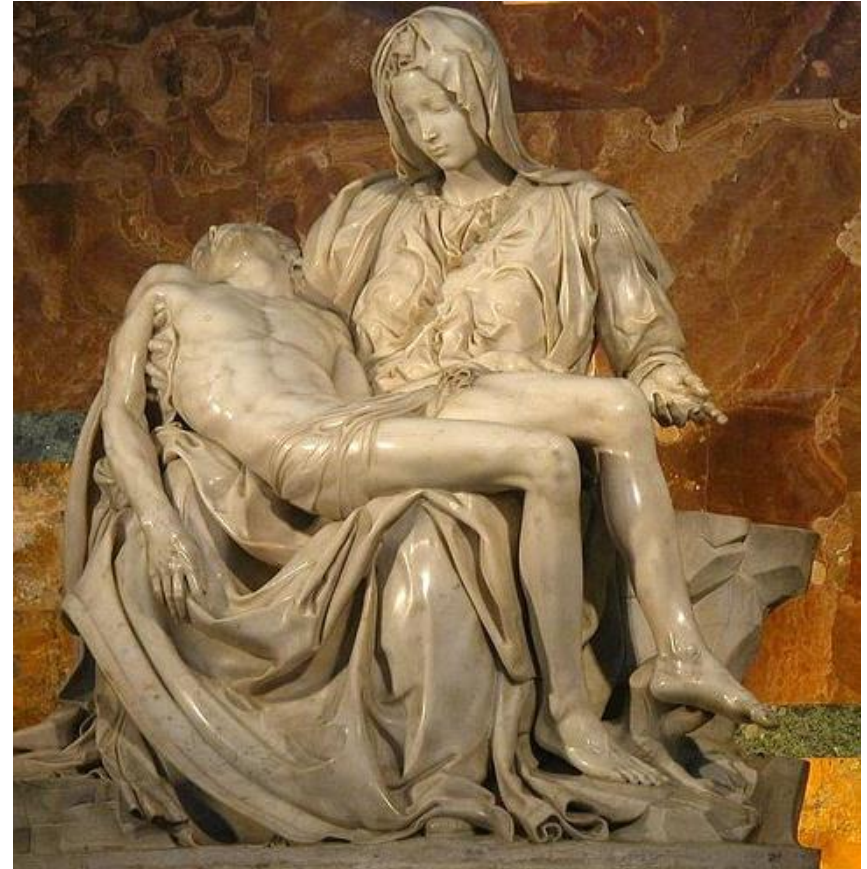
What Makes You, YOU?

Explore:

- 2) How Jesus provides for the Church in and through his death

Apply:

What do these two ideas – the Kingship of Jesus and his provision for us – mean for us today?

On crucifixion:

- “Invented” by the Assyrians in 8th c BCE
- Not discussed in contemporary literature due to its cruel nature
- Slow death over multiple days via asphyxiation
- Normally bodies left to rot as a warning sign to populace
- Only one body ever found archaeologically
- A sign of God’s disgrace in 1st c CE Jewish thought: Deut. 21:22-23

Not found in John:

- *Simon of Cyrene (all 3)*
- *Wailing women on way to Calvary (Luke)*
- *Offering of drugged potion (Mk. / Matt.)*
- *Jesus' prayer of forgiveness for executioners (Luke)*
- *Time indications (all 3)*
- *Various mockeries (all 3)*
- *Repentance of "good" terrorist (Luke)*
- *Darkness over the land (all 3)*
- *Cry, "Eloi, Eloi, ..." (Mk. / Matt.)*
- *Suggestion to seek deliverance by Elijah (Mk. / Matt.)*
- *"Father, into your hands..." (Luke)*
- *Rending of the Temple curtain (all 3)*
- *Earthquake and opening of tombs (Matt.)*
- *Reaction of centurion (all 3)*
- *Repentance of multitudes going home (Luke)*
- *Pilate's investigation to affirm Jesus' death (Mk.)*
- *Wrapping of body in linen shroud (all 3)*
- *Presence of women at the tomb at burial (all 3)*
- *Purchase of spices by women (Luke)*

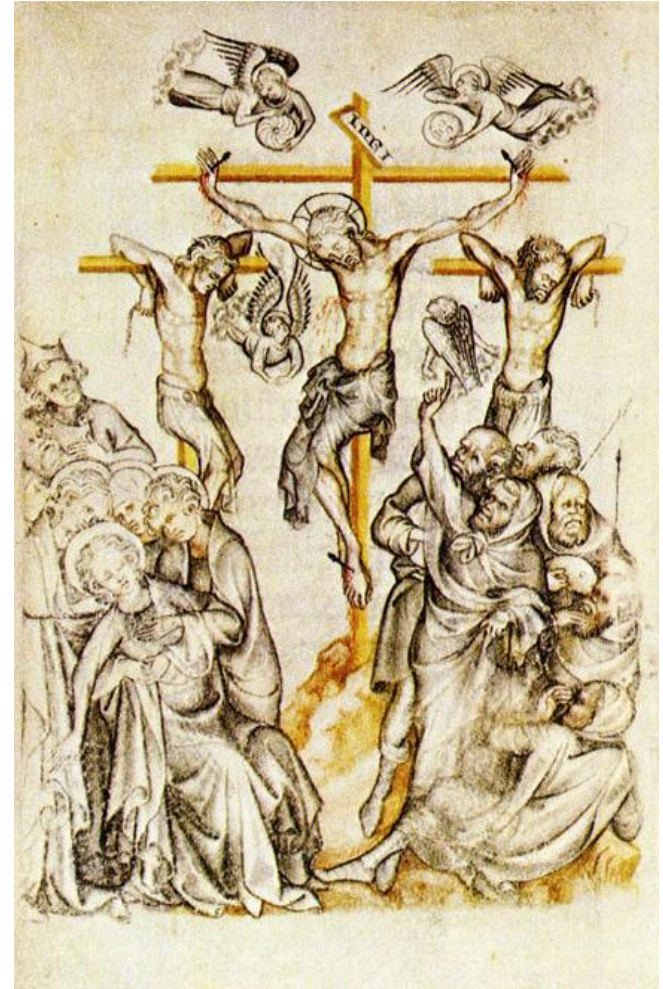

How would you describe these two men in relation to their faith in Jesus?

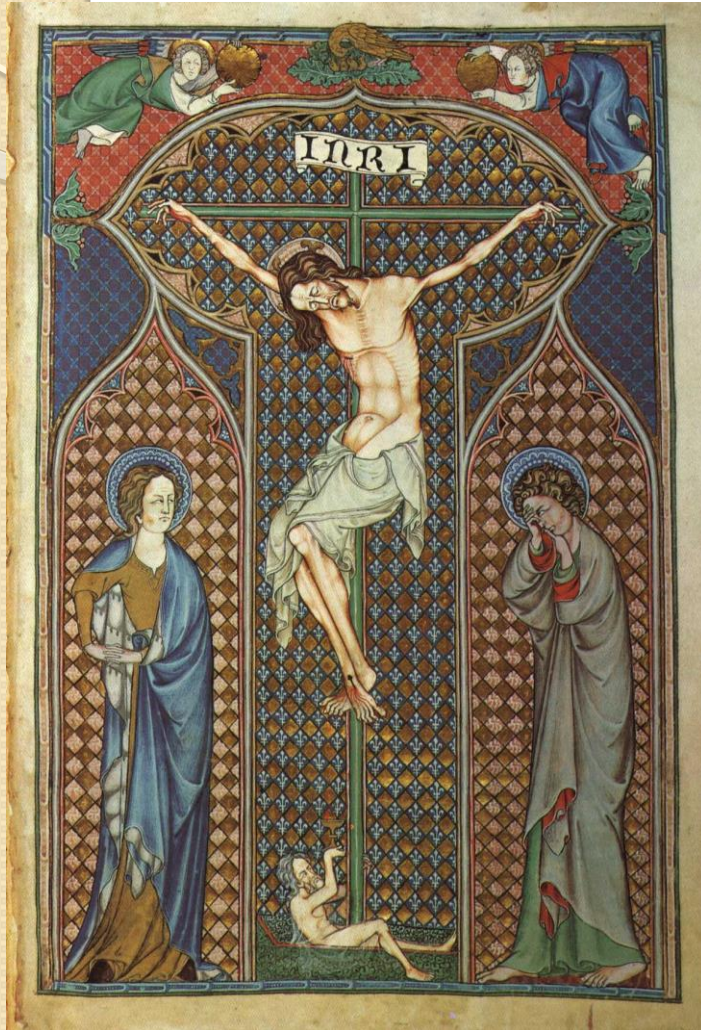
Why did they rush to put Jesus' body in the tomb?
