Interpreting Visionary / Apocalyptic Genre

- Lots of symbols – beasts, numbers, angelic mediation
- *Depicts* a literal reality, but descriptions don't *represent* the events literally
- Understand scene and symbol as a whole; don't press too hard
- If author explains a picture, use it as anchor point for understanding
- Read widely in the literature – biblical and extra-biblical
- Use your imagination!
- Seek to identify the historical event or theological reality expressed by the passage (and be willing to admit an exact understanding might be beyond us)

- Why does Daniel say to spare the pagan magicians, sorcerers, etc?
- Who does Daniel give credit to for interpreting the dream?
